

# **ECONOMIC IMPACT DUE TO COVID-19**

- LA County has 139,000 businesses in industries with the highest risk of job losses. A likely conservative estimate of their annual revenue (also per D&B) is \$125 billion (Dunn & Bradstreet).
- Leisure and hospitality declined the most, losing 20,000 jobs. This was the largest month-over drop going back to 1990.



# **ECONOMIC IMPACT DUE TO COVID-19 ANALYSIS**

- In March 2020, Los Angeles County saw an increase of 320,500 unemployed individuals resulting in a 6.4% unemployment rate
- LA County Workforce Board Area represents 35% of all unemployment insurance claims received in the County.
- For March, 459,665 individuals filed for Unemployment Insurance within Los Angeles County



# **AVERT BUSINESS CLOSURE AND AVOID LAYOFFS**



In partnership with LAEDC, we provided Business Technical Assistance to **892 unique businesses** with layoff aversion services since the State/County/Federal state of emergency was declared.

This has resulted in **596** layoffs being averted during the month of March.

In March and first two weeks in April, there has been an increase of **470%** over our monthly average of WARN notices

# LOS ANGELES COUNTY EMPLOYER ASSISTANCE GRANT FUND

WDACS launched the Employer Assistance Grant Fund, the first grant initiative launched across the County, and first ever at WDACS, aimed at helping small businesses economically impacted by COVID-19. **150 applications** were received on April 9, 2020 in 8 minutes, and almost **9,000 businesses** are on the waitlist.

Provided additional COVID-19 resources to **6,900+** businesses on the LA County Employer Assistance Grant Fund waitlist.



# LA County WDACS to launch \$500,000 Employer Assistance Grant Fund

Webinar to provide guidance to local businesses on how to apply for these grants

LOS ANGELES, CA: Today, the Los Angeles County Department of Workforce Development, Aging and Community Services (WDACS), with support of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, announced that the LA County Employer Assistance Grant Fund will be launched on Wed., April 8. The LA County Employer Assistance Grant Fund will provide a total of \$500,000 to local businesses. Individual businesses may be awarded up to \$10,000 based on demonstrated need. Approximately 25% of awards will be reserved for social enterprises that demonstrate a need and ability to serve vulnerable populations. Applications will be processed on a first-come-first-served basis, and will close once 150 applications are received.
